Limited Review Report on Unaudited Quarterly Standalone Financial Results of VISA Steel Limited pursuant to regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirement) Regulation, 2015, as amended

To, The Board of Directors, VISA Steel Limited VISA HOUSE 8/10 Alipore Road Kolkata – 700 027

1. We have reviewed the accompanying statement of unaudited standalone financial results of **VISA Steel Limited** ('the Company') for the quarter ended June 30, 2025 together with notes thereon (herein after referred to as 'the Statement'), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (the Regulation) as amended.

Management's Responsibility for the standalone financial results

2. This Statement is the responsibility of the Company's Management and approved by the Board of Directors in their meeting held on August 14, 2025. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the Statement based on our review.

Auditor's Responsibility

3. We conducted our review of the statement in accordance with the Standard on Review Engagement (SRF) 2410 "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity", issued by Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with the Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. We have not performed an audit and accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Basis of Qualified Conclusion

4. We draw attention to Note 6 of the accompanying statement with regard to non-recognition of interest expense on the borrowings of the Company. The accumulated interest not provided as on June 30, 2025 is Rs. 13,645.52 million (including Rs.1,459.69 million for FY 2016-17, Rs.1,552.29 million for FY 2017-18, Rs.1,465.46 million for FY 2018-19, Rs.1,443.39 million for FY 2019-20, Rs.1,286.83 million for FY 2020-21, Rs.1,289.27 million for FY 2021-22, Rs.1,404.62 million for FY 2022-23, Rs.1,743.58 million for FY 2023-24, Rs.1,601.10 million for FY 2024-25 and Rs. 399.29 million for the quarter ended June 30, 2025 respectively) which is not in accordance with the requirement of Ind AS 23: 'Borrowing Cost' read with Ind AS 109: 'Financial Instruments'.

Had the aforesaid interest expense been recognized, finance cost for the quarter ended June 30, 2025 would have been Rs. 478.35 million instead of the reported amount of Rs. 79.06 million. Total expenses for the quarter ended June 30, 2025 would have been Rs. 2,074.58 million instead of the reported amount of Rs. 1,675.29 million. Net profit/ (loss) after tax for the quarter ended June 30, 2025 would have been Rs. (356.07) million instead of the reported amount of Rs. 43.22 million. Total Comprehensive Income for the quarter ended June 30, 2025 would have been Rs. (356.55) million instead of the reported amount of Rs. 42.74 million. Earnings/(Loss) per share for the quarter ended June 30, 2025 would have been Rs. (3.08) instead of the reported amount of Rs.0.37.

The above reported interest has been calculated using Simple Interest rate.







Qualified Conclusion

5. Based on our review conducted as above, except for the matter described in the Basis of Qualified Conclusion paragraph above, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying statement of unaudited standalone financial results prepared in accordance with the applicable Indian Accounting Standards as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with relevant rules issued there under and other recognized accounting practices and policies, has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in terms of the Regulation, as amended, read with the Circular, including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.

6. We draw your attention to the following matters:

a) Material Uncertainty Relating to Going Concern

We draw attention to Note - 5 and 7 to the unaudited standalone financial results regarding the preparation of the statement on a going concern basis, for the reason stated therein. The Company has accumulated losses as on June 30, 2025. As on date, the Company's current liabilities are substantially higher than its current assets and the Company's net worth has also been fully eroded.

Oriental Bank of Commerce, since merged with Punjab National Bank (PNB), had filed an application before NCLT for initiating CIRP under IBC against the Company which was admitted by NCLT vide order dated 28 November 2022 and an Interim Resolution Professional had been appointed. Meanwhile, Hon'ble Orissa High Court has stayed the operation of the NCLT order dated 28 November 2022. PNB had since assigned its debt to Assets Care and Reconstruction Enterprise Limited (ACRE) and ACRE had filled substitution application in the matter.

These conditions indicate the existence of a material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern and therefore it may be unable to realize its assets and discharge its liabilities including potential liabilities in the normal course of business. All the assets and liabilities are still being carried at their book value except property, plant and equipment, which have been impaired in the previous year, and are being carried at its recoverable value. The appropriateness of assumption of going concern, and evaluation of recoverable value of its non-current assets is critically dependent upon the debt resolution of the Company which is under process, the Company's ability to raise requisite finance, generate cash flows in future to meet its obligations and to earn profits in future. The ability of the Company to continue as a going concern is solely dependent on the successful outcome of these conditions, which are not wholly within the control of the Company

The Management of the Company has prepared the statement on a going concern basis based on their assessment of the successful outcome of the debt resolution, till then the Company's operations continue under conversion arrangement.

b) We draw attention to Note – 7 of the standalone financial results which describes that majority of the lenders with 95% of the debt have been assigned to ACRE. The Company is currently engaged in discussions with ACRE for restructuring of its outstanding loan exposure including waiver of interest through an out of court settlement, and no adjustment has been carried out in the books of accounts.

Our conclusion is not qualified in respect to the above matters.

Other Matter

7. The figures for the quarter ended March 31, 2025 as reported in these financial results are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full previous financial year and the published year to date figures up to the third quarter of the previous financial year. The figures up to the end of the third quarter of previous financial year had only been reviewed and not subjected to audit.

Our conclusion is not qualified in respect of above matter.

- 1 The above unaudited financial results of the Company were reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of the Company at their respective meetings held on 14 August 2025. The Statutory Auditors have conducted the limited review of the above Standalone unaudited financial results.
- 2 The standalone financial results of the company for the quarter ended 30 June 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act 2013 read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and relevant rules thereafter.
- 3 The Company is in the business of Ferro Alloys and hence has only one reportable operating segment as per Ind AS 108 "Operating Segments".
- 4 Revenue from Operations includes reimbursement towards materials at actuals, wherever applicable, used under conversion arrangement and hence is not comparable with previous periods.
- The Company had been incurring losses in the earlier years which has adversely affected the net worth of the Company. The Company's financial performance has been adversely affected due to non-availability of working capital for operations, and other external factors beyond the Company's control. It is expected that the overall financial health of the Company would improve after debt resolution and improvement in availability of working capital. Accordingly, the Company has prepared the financial results on the basis of going concern assumption. The statutory auditors have also drawn attention to the above matter without qualifying their conclusion in their Review Report.
- The secured debt of the Company has been categorised as Non-Performing Assets by the lenders effective 11 July 2012 and accordingly, the Company has stopped providing further interest in its books effective 1 April 2016. The amount of interest expenses not provided for is estimated at Rs. 399.29 Million for the quarter ended 30 June 2025 and the accumulated amount of interest not provided as on 30 June 2025 is estimated at Rs. 13,645.52 Million. The statutory auditors have qualified their Review Report in respect of this matter.
- 7 Oriental Bank of Commerce, since merged with Punjab National Bank (PNB), had filed an application for initiating CIRP under IBC which was admitted vide NCLT order dated 28 November 2022. Meanwhile, Hon'ble Orissa High Court had stayed the operation of the NCLT order dated 28 November 2022. PNB had since assigned its debt to Assets Care & Reconstruction Enterprise Limited (ACRE) on 25 August 2023 and subsequently ACRE had filed Substitution Application in the matter. Majority of the lenders with 95% of the debt have assigned their debt to ACRE. The Company is engaged with ACRE for restructuring its outstanding loan exposure including waiver of interest through out of court settlement, and no adjustment has been carried out in the books of accounts.
- 8 The Exceptional Items of previous periods represent (a) impairment loss on fixed assets of Rs. 4,380.75 million (b) write off of abandoned projects lying in Capital Work in Progress Rs. 387.50 million (c) write back of difference between the outstanding amount and settlement amount of the loan exposure of Rs. 75.04 million.
- 9 The Company received a notice dated 10 July 2025 from the State Pollution Control Board, Odisha (SPCB) regarding refusal to renew Consent to Operate (CTO). The Company has submitted a response to SPCB and requested for grant of CTO to resume operations.
- 10 The figures for the quarter ended 31 March 2025 are balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of financial year ended 31 March 2025 and the unaudited published figures up to nine months ended 31 December 2024.

- 1 The above unaudited consolidated financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of the Parent Company at their respective meetings held on 14 August 2025. The Statutory Auditors have conducted the limited review of the above Consolidated unaudited financial results.
- 2 The consolidated unaudited financial results of VISA Steel Limited ("the Company" or "the Parent") and its subsidiary ("the Group"), together with its joint venture for the quarter ended 30 June 2025, have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and relevent rules thereafter.
- As on 30 June 2025, VISA Steel Group ("the Group") comprises the Parent Company i.e. VISA Steel Limited, its one subsidiary and one Joint Venture Company.
- The Group is in the business of Ferro Alloys and hence has only one reportable operating segment as per Ind AS 108 "Operating Segments".
- Revenue from Operations includes reimbursement towards materials at actuals, wherever applicable, used under conversion arrangement and hence is not comparable with previous periods.
- The Parent Company had been incurring losses in the earlier years which has adversely affected the net worth of the Parent Company. The Parent Company's financial performance has been adversely affected due to non-availability of working capital for operations, and other external factors beyond the Parent Company's control. It is expected that the overall financial health of the Parent Company would improve after debt resolution and improvement in availability of working capital. Accordingly, the Parent Company has prepared the financial results on the basis of going concern assumption. The statutory auditors have also drawn attention to the above matter without qualifying their conclusion in their Review Report.
- The secured debt of the Parent Company has been categorised as Non-Performing Assets (NPA) by the lenders effective 11 July 2012 and accordingly, the Parent Company has stopped providing further interest in its books effective 1 April 2016. The amount of interest expenses not provided for is estimated at Rs. 399.29 Million for the guarter ended 30 June 2025 and the accumulated interest not provided as on 30 June 2025 is estimated at Rs. 13,645.52 Million. The statutory auditors have qualified their Review Report in respect of this matter.
- Oriental Bank of Commerce, since merged with Punjab National Bank (PNB), had filed an application for initiating CIRP under IBC which was admitted vide NCLT order dated 28 November 2022. Meanwhile, Hon'ble Orissa High Court had stayed the operation of the NCLT order dated 28 November 2022. PNB had since assigned its debt to Assets Care & Reconstruction Enterprise Limited (ACRE) on 25 August 2023 and subsequently ACRE had filed Substitution Application in the matter. Majority of the lenders with 95% of the debt have assigned their debt to ACRE. The Parent Company is engaged with ACRE for restructuring its outstanding loan exposure including waiver of interest through out of court settlement, and no adjustment has been carried out in the books of accounts.
- The Exceptional Items of previous periods represent (a) impairment loss on fixed assets of Rs. 4,380.75 million (b) write off of abandoned projects lying in Capital Work in Progress Rs. 387.50 million (c) write back of difference between the outstanding amount and settlement amount of the loan exposure of Rs. 75.04 million.
- 10 The Parent Company received a notice dated 10 July 2025 from the State Pollution Control Board, Odisha (SPCB) regarding refusal to renew Consent to Operate (CTO). The Parent Company has submited a response to SPCB and requested for grant of CTO to resume operations.
- 11 The figures for the quarter ended 31 March 2025 are balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of financial year ended 31 March 2025 and the unaudited published figures up to nine months ended 31 December 2024.
